



Pastor: I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the LORD!" You have said, "Seek my face."


All: Our hearts say to you, "Your face, LORD, do we seek."


Pastor: One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life,

¹⁹ For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. ²⁰ To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. ²¹ To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. ²² To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. Corporate Confession of Sin—based on I John I:5-8

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We have heard your message and it has been proclaimed to us. You are light, and in You there is no darkness at all.

All: If we say we have fellowship with you while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.

Pastor: But if we walk in the light as You are in the light, we have fellowship with on another.

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.






At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

Prayer Focus—Josh (Gina) Rieger is a church planter with Mission to the World (the foreign mission agency of the PCA) in Hexham, which is in Northumberland, England, one of the less densely populated counties in England, the most secular and most northern county in England. One hundred years ago Northumberland had 90 Presbyterian Church in 4 Presbyteries but today there are only 3 evangelical churches. Josh and Gina have ministered for six years in Northern England. Five years ago they planted a new church in Hexham, a town that has not had an evangelical church in 40 years. Please pray for Joshua and Gina in the following ways:

- that the Lord would bless the congregation with families and young adults. Over the last year we've had two families and a few young adults begin to attend. Pray this would continue. This is a blessing to the church, but also a great blessing for the Rieger children. However, the young adults in particular would love more fellowship with people their age.
- continue to pray for other mothers with whom Gina would be able to develop close friendships. Two new mothers have joined the church in the last year, a specific answer to your prayers. Pray that Gina would develop close friendships with these women and also women in the community to whom she could witness.
- that the Lord would develop love and unity in the church. The members come from all sorts of backgrounds and this has led to tensions in the congregation in the past.
- that the Lord would raise up men to serve as elders and deacons. Josh is currently going through training with one man who is a potential elder. Pray as we go through the process of calling this man to be an elder in the coming months.
- for the new members course over the next 2 Sundays. There are 8-10 people who have started attending over the last few months we are praying will come into membership in the coming weeks.
- for several non-believers or very weak believers who attend the church from time to time, that the Lord would continue to draw them to himself.
- for Josh's work with Boy's Brigade at the local Methodist Church. Most of the boys who come are from non-believing homes and the weekly devotionals from the Word each week are their first introduction to the Scriptures.
- for Nate's visit to Hexham in April. He will be the speaker for our second biannual Hexham Bible Conference.

Today's message, "The Power of Being Emptied" is taken from Philippians 2:5-11. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group (HFG)

- Based on today's message, how is a Christian's view of power, position, and influence different from that of the world?
- Considering Philippians 2:6-8, how does Jesus Christ use His power, position, and influence?
- When Paul says Christ "emptied himself," what exactly does he mean and why is that significant?
- Paul writes in I Corinthians 9:22, "That I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some." How is Paul's approach to mission an expression of Christ's "emptying" in Philippians 2?
- Discuss with those around you what a modern-day example of becoming all things to all men might look like. Then consider the positions of power and influence the Lord has given you. From your positions of influence, what would it look like for you to be emptied for others?
- What was your biggest takeaway from today's message?
