



Pastor: For though the Lord is high, he regards the lowly, but the haughty he knows from afar.


All: Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve my life;

New Testament Reading—Hebrews 12:1-6, 12-14

I Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, 2 looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

3 Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. 4 In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. 5 And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons?

"My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord,

nor be weary when reproved by him.

6 For the Lord disciplines the one he loves,

and chastises every son whom he receives."

12 Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, 13 and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed. 14 Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord.

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Congregational Prayer of Confession—based on 2 Peter 1:3-11

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. Your divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and

godliness, through the knowledge of Christ which calls us to his own glory and excellence.

All: As partakers of the divine nature,

we have escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desires.

Pastor: We are to make every effort to supplement our faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge,

and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness.

All: But we supplement depravity with willful ignorance and indulgence to try and escape responsibility.

We are to supplement godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love.

Pastor: All:

But we seek after our own interests and self-preservation.

Pastor: Thus we are ineffective and unfruitful in the knowledge of you, O Lord.

All: Because we lack these qualities we are nearsighted and blind and we forget that we were cleansed from our former sins.

Pastor: Father, make us all the more diligent to confirm our calling and election

and to practice these qualities of godliness.

All: For we know that in this way we will be richly provided with an entrance

into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Assurance of Pardon—Psalm 28:6-9


Blessed be the LORD! For he has heard the voice of my pleas for mercy.

Leader: The grass withers, the flower fades;


All: But the Word of our God will stand forever.

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
GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS
