




Service of Celebration and Gospel Renewal Fourth Sunday of Easter 03 May 2020

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE AND REVEALS HIMSELF

God calls His people to worship and come before Him. The Creator of all things reveals Himself through His Word and calls us into His presence.

Introit—I Know that My Redeemer Lives, Vs I



Call to Worship-from Psalm 78:1-7

Pastor: O my people, give ear to My teaching; listen to the words of My mouth!

- All: Things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us.
- Pastor: Tell of the glorious deeds of the LORD, and His might, and the wonders that He has done.
- All: We will not hide them from our children, but will tell them to the coming generation.
- Pastor: You, O Lord, have established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel and have commanded us to teach it to our children that the next generation might know them, and that children yet unborn shall arise and tell them to their children.
- All: So that they should set their hope in You and not forget Your works, but keep Your commandments.

New Testament Reading—Ephesians 4:7-16

7 But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. 8 Therefore it says,

"When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men."


9 (In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower regions, the earth?2 10 He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) 11 And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. 15 Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

Elder: This is the Word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.

Corporate Confession of Sin-based on Titus 3:1-3

Pastor:	Lord, we come confessing. You call us to be submissive to rulers and authorities
	and to be obedient and ready for every good work.
All:	Far too often, we only want to submit to authority that we respect
	or rulers with whom we agree. We think we are free to disobey.
Pastor:	We are to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle,
	and to show perfect courtesy toward all people.
All:	Instead, we defend our actions by maligning others, by blaming others,
	and encouraging quarrels that help our cause.
	We fail to be gentle and to treat others more kindly than ourselves.
Pastor:	For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray,
	slaves to various passions and pleasures.
All:	We passed our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another.

Silent Prayers of Confession

Assurance of Pardon—Titus 3:4-7

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.




