




God calls His people to worship and come before Him. The Creator of all things reveals Himself through His Word and calls us into His presence.



Call to Worship—from Psalm 96:I-9

Pastor: Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth!
All: Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day.
Pastor: Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples!
All: For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods.
Pastor: For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the Lord made the heavens.
All: Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary.
Pastor: Ascribe to the Lord, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength!
All: Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; bring an offering, and come into his courts!
Pastor: Worship the Lord in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth!



Corporate Confession of Sin-based on Hebrews 12:3-11

Pastor:	Lord, we come confessing. We grow weary and fainthearted
	because we do not consider Christ who endured hostility against himself.
All:	In our struggle against sin, we have not resisted to the point of shedding our blood.
Pastor:	We too often forget the exhortation that addresses us as Your children.
All:	We try to excuse, escape or disregard Your discipline and grow weary when You reprove us.
Pastor:	Yet You discipline the ones You love, and chastise every son and daughter Your receive.
All:	Give us grace to endure under discipline knowing that You are treating us as Your children.
Pastor:	We know that if we are left without discipline, than we are not true children of God.
	For You discipline us for our good, that we may share in Your holiness.
	For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant.
All:	But remind us that discipline later yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness
	to those who have been trained by it.



* "Catholic" refers to the universal church of God's people throughout all time and from all places






