

All: For the sake of Your steadfast love and Your faithfulness!


Pastor: Why should the nations say, "Where is their God?


All: Our God is in the heavens; He does all that He pleases.

New Testament Reading—I Corinthians 15:20-28


²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. ²⁴ Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. ²⁵ For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death. ²⁷ For "God has put all things in subjection under his feet." But when it says, "all things are put in subjection," it is plain that he is excepted who put all things in subjection under him. ²⁸ When all things are subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to him who put all things in subjection under him.

Corporate Confession of Sin—based on Philippians 2:1-10

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. Although there is great encouragement in Christ, comfort in love, participation in the Spirit, and affection and sympathy, we are not of the same mind,

- All: Neither do we share the same love or act in one accord.
- Pastor: We act in pride-desiring the best for ourselves and wanting others to fail.
- All: We do not act in humility nor consider others more significant than ourselves.
- Pastor: We look to our own interests and ignore the interests of others.
- All: We do not have the mind of Christ Jesus—
- because we act as if we were equal with God. Pastor: We resist acting as a servant, humbling ourselves, and obeying—
- All: Especially to the point of self-sacrifice or death.
- Pastor: But Christ did obey and humbled Himself on our behalf, therefore,
 - God has highly exalted Him and given Him the name that is above every name,
 - so that at the name of Jesus our knees will bow along with all in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

All: And our tongues will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Silent Prayers of Confession

Assurance of Pardon—Romans 8:32-34

He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.



Profession of Faith—The Apostles' Creed


We believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Creator of heaven and earth,

Words of Institution and the Lord's Table

Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Pastoral Notes
