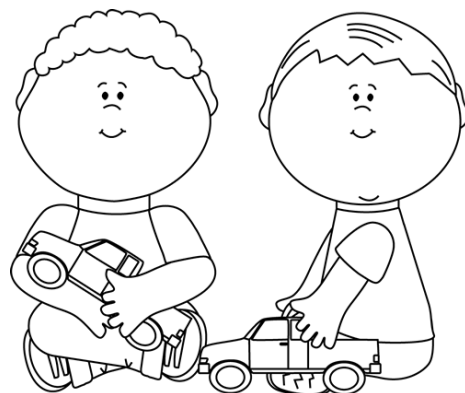
THE CALL TO WORSHIP IS FROM PSALM 30. UNSCRAMBLE THE WORDS BELOW.

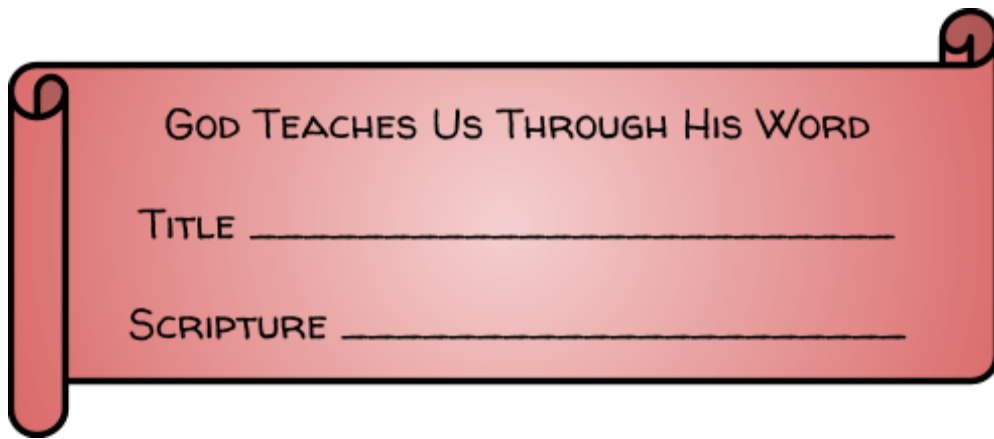
In the confession today, we speak words from Matthew 23 about the Pharisees “who preach but do not practice.”

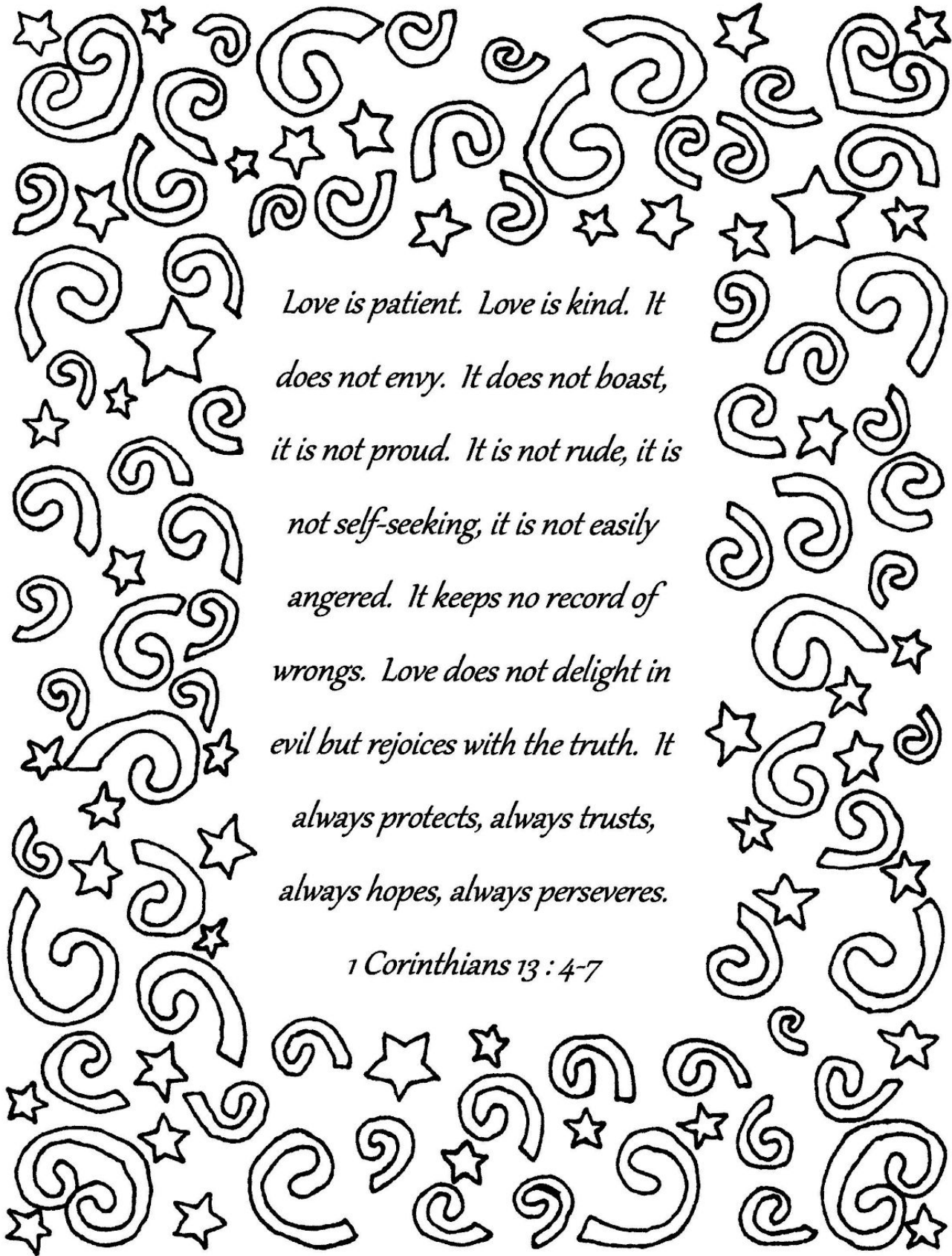
