
This is the pattern of his love in redeeming and saving his people.

The Reading of the Word—Genesis I:I-25

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

³ And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

⁶ And God said, "Let there be an expanse in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." ⁷ And God made the expanse and separated the waters that were under the expanse from the waters that were above the expanse. And it was so. ¹⁶ And God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. ¹⁷ And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, ¹⁸ to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹ And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

²⁰And God said, "Let the waters swarm with swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the heavens." ²¹ So God created the great sea creatures and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarm, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. ²² And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth."




At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.



Today's message, "The Forming and Filling of Creation" is taken from Genesis I:I-25. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group.

- How do the terms tohu wabohu ("without form and void") in Genesis I:2 provide the outline for the unfolding of the days of creation?
- It's noteworthy that the post-exodus Israelites were the original audience of Genesis. How does
 the creation story of Genesis stand in opposition to the popular notions in Egypt regarding
 creation?
- Many in our time claim that the creation account of Genesis I-2 is nothing more than a myth and should not be understood or treated as history. What is wrong with this perspective? Why is it critical that we understand the creation account of Genesis I-2 as history?
- Gnosticism teaches that spiritual things are good and material things are bad. The Christian church, sadly, has fallen into such notions throughout its history. How does the Bible's creation story refute Gnostic tendencies and draw us toward the goodness of creation?
- Take time now to reflect on your engagement with creation. How is the Lord calling you into
 deeper connection to and appreciation of creation as an act of worship to God? Discuss various
 ways (disciplines or practices) that would foster a deeper relationship to God through creation.
