
This is the pattern of his love in redeeming and saving his people.





The Reading of the Word—Luke 20:27-44

27 There came to him some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, 28 and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother. 29 Now there were seven brothers. The first took a wife, and died without children. 30 And the second 31 and the third took her, and likewise all seven left no children and died. 32 Afterward the woman also died. 33 In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had her as wife."



LITURGICAL CALENDAR AND EPIPHANY

God built within His people an innate desire to celebrate, to mark seasons and events, to set up "stones of remembrance" so that we do not forget His goodness and promises. One method that the Church has used over time is dividing each year according to the events in the life of Christ—a reminder of redemptive history. Although the Church Calendar is not prescribed by Scripture, it can be a useful framework or tool to help walk our hearts through the Gospel every year.

The major divisions of the liturgical year are:

- Advent—The four Sundays leading to Christmas; preparation for the coming of Christ and the need for a Savior
- Christmas and the Twelve Days—Celebration of the Incarnation and the Gift of Christ, our Redeemer
- Epiphany—January 6; Coming of the Magi for Christ is the Light of the World; Hope for the Gentiles; Kingship of Christ
- Lent—from Ash Wednesday to Easter; repentance and reflection; recognition that our sinfulness leads to the cross; intentional time to exercise the disciplines of grace
- Holy Week—Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday; Jesus as King, Priest, Prophet; The remembrance that the shedding of blood was necessary for the forgiveness of sins
- Easter—Resurrection of the Living Lord; the conquering of death and sin
- Ascension—Christ in Power at the right hand of the Father; Christ interceding as the Mediator
- Pentecost—Coming of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church; God sends out His people as the Church
- Ordinary Time—The weeks between Pentecost and Advent; Living in light of the Gospel as the Church

In Luke 20:27-40, the Sadducees try to catch Jesus in a theological trap question about the resurrection. Jesus sprung the trap by faithfully interpretation the Old Testament Scriptures, leaving the Sadducees speechless. Take a look at the questions below. Each one is designed to help you understand and apply this section of Scripture. Please take time to discuss your answers with your family, a friend, or your Home Fellowship Group.

- ➤ Who are the Sadducees and what was their role in Jewish religious life?
- ➤ Underneath the Sadducees question was the custom of levirate marriage. What is levirate marriage? Read Deut. 25:5-10 for more information.
- The Sadducees did not believe the Old Testament taught a doctrine of resurrection. Jesus argued otherwise in our passage. Can you explain Jesus' logic?
- Apart from Jesus reference in our passage, where else would you turn in the Old Testament to defend the doctrine of the resurrection?
- ➤ Paul says that if Christ has not been raised then our preaching and faith are in vain (I Corinthians 15:14). Why is the resurrection of Christ essential to the gospel?
- What difference is (or should) the resurrection be making in your life presently? Be as specific as you can.
