# Pastoral Notes

Dear Cornerstone Family,

Greetings and blessings to you in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Earlier this week I was thinking about the years I've shared with Christy in marriage. Recounting the ups and downs, twists and turns, I found myself tearing up at the unspeakably precious gift Christy has been to me over the years. I can honestly say that one of the most grounding and comforting realities of my life is knowing that she loves me.

Reflecting on the sweetness and sturdiness of her love for me produces grateful peace in my heart. For regardless of how inadequate I feel or what anyone else thinks or says about me, I know she loves me. I'm her person no matter what.

This is all the more astonishing when I consider *who I am.* Shocker, I'm not an easy person to live with. But my scattered, running-thin, and embarrassingly selfish self doesn't rattle her. She takes it in stride and accepts me warts and all while her example continually nudges me toward being a better man—the man I know God has called me to be.

Even after all the foolish things I've said and done, after all the ways I've fallen short, her love hasn't budged. Her affection remains. Her patience is steady. Even after I do "that thing" for the umpteenth time, she *forgives* me. She forgives *me*.

Despite how it sounds, Christy is not perfect. Far from it! She's a sinner like the rest of us. But I can honestly say the Lord has been pleased to use her example of love as a *vision of grace* in my life.

What do I mean by a vision of grace?

Well, take this in. If you have trusted in Jesus Christ alone for salvation, then you are a child of God. And if you are a child of God, you are loved with perfect patience by your Heavenly Father. Though you have fallen short countless times (it's far worse than you know), his love for you hasn't wavered once. The Father is not in heaven wishing he had the "good kid next door" and not you as his child. No, as hard as it may be to wrap your head around this, he delights in loving you.

Sure, you disappoint him. There's no way around that. But know this—his grief over your sin is the evidence of his love for you. In the way that a loving parent grieves over a child who wanders away from the Lord, the Father grieves when you leave the comfort of his love and commands. He grieves when you forsake him and bow down to the idols of the world and the flesh.

But don't despair. You're in the house of God. Today, the Father gathers up his robe and runs toward you in love. In the finished work of Jesus Christ by the power of the Spirit, the Father takes you into his arms and rejoices to welcome you, "My prodigal child is home again!"

As we worship today, let's remain in his love (John 15:9)

Worship is a response to the love of God that brings us out of darkness into his light. The rhythm and flow of the service reflects this present reality as God calls his people and reveals himself, forgives their sins, teaches them from his Word, the Bible, feeds them, and then sends them out to live what they have learned.


This is the pattern of his love in redeeming and saving his people.

**Worship Notes**— Today we are looking at the Third Servant Song, found in Isaiah 50, in which the servant will "sustain him with a word him who is weary," even as He Himself relies upon the Lord for His strength and vindication as he endures suffering (vs 7-8). The Call to Worship is taken from Psalm 27, which reminds us that "The Lord is our light and our salvation," and thus we need not look elsewhere as we seek His face. In the opening hymn, Give Thanks to God the Lord, we sing praises that we can trust God and look to "The Lord's great strength..." because His "...word continues yet." The New Testament reading from I Peter encourages us to look to Christ in our sufferings and "rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings." After we have confessed the weakness and sinfulness of our flesh from Psalm 38 and have been Assured from Romans 8 that God has justified his elect through Christ's work on our behalf, we then praise our Lord from *Isaiah 43*, who is with us through the fire and flood and who is our Savior. The second communion hymn is Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted. We read in the sermon passage today that "I gave my back to those who strike, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I hid not my face from disgrace and spitting." These themes will continue in the following weeks through the Servant Songs and directs our attention back to the work of Christ on Good Friday, where through His pain, his sufferings, and his death on the cross "none shall ever be confounded who on Him their hope have made." We then, with the words of Before the Throne of God Above exult in Christ's victory and interceding for us on the throne where our "life is hid with Christ on high."

<sup>19</sup> Therefore let those who suffer according to God's will entrust their souls to a faithful Creator while doing good.



## Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. Proceed to the first table for the bread, and then on the second for wine/juice.

Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen


#### GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

# Taking the Message Home

Today's message, "Servant of the Lord: Obedient and Faithful to the End," is taken from Isaiah 50:4-11. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group (HFG).

- Take a few minutes to examine your listening habits. What caught your ear this week? How did what you listened to this week affect your soul? Could your weekly listening habits be negatively impacting your walk with the Lord?
- Isaiah tells us the Servant of the Lord has an "awakened" ear that is well taught (vs. 4-5). What does this mean? Why is this good news for us?
- The Servant of the Lord also has a tongue that can sustain the weary with words. Where do we see Jesus Christ modeling this in the New Testament? How would you like to grow in this way?
- Did Jesus Christ's wisdom in both listening and speaking prepare him to suffer on our behalf (see v. 6)? Take a few minutes to reflect on this.
- Where did Jesus Christ's confidence come from in this text (see vs. 7-9)? Is this a confidence that we, too, can share?
- Reflecting on vs. 10-11, how might you be trying to walk by your own light rather than by faith in the name of the Lord? What would repentance look like?
