





All: and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.


# Silent Prayers of Confession

# GOD TEACHES US THROUGH HIS WORD

# The Reading of the Word—Genesis 4:1-26

Now Adam knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, saying, "I have gotten a man with the help of the LORD." <sup>2</sup> And again, she bore his brother Abel. Now Abel was a keeper of sheep, and Cain a worker of the ground. <sup>3</sup> In the course of time Cain brought to the LORD an offering of the fruit of the ground, <sup>4</sup> and Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the LORD had regard for Abel and his offering, <sup>5</sup> but for Cain and his offering he had no regard. So Cain was very angry, and his face fell. <sup>6</sup> The LORD said to Cain,

"Why are you angry, and why has your face fallen? <sup>7</sup> If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is contrary to you, but you must rule over it."

<sup>8</sup> Cain spoke to Abel his brother. And when they were in the field, Cain rose up against his brother Abel and killed him. <sup>9</sup> Then the LORD said to Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" He said, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?" <sup>10</sup> And the LORD said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground. <sup>11</sup> And now you are cursed from the ground, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand. <sup>12</sup> When you work the ground, it shall no longer yield to you its strength. You shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth." <sup>13</sup> Cain said to the LORD, "My punishment is greater than I can bear. <sup>14</sup> Behold, you have driven me today away from the ground, and from your face I shall be hidden. I shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me." <sup>15</sup> Then the LORD said to him, "Not so! If anyone kills Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold." And the LORD put a mark on Cain, lest any who found him should attack him. <sup>16</sup> Then Cain went away from the presence of the LORD and settled in the land of Nod, east of Eden.

<sup>17</sup> Cain knew his wife, and she conceived and bore Enoch. When he built a city, he called the name of the city after the name of his son, Enoch. <sup>18</sup> To Enoch was born Irad, and Irad fathered Mehujael, and Mehujael fathered Methushael, and Methushael fathered Lamech. <sup>19</sup> And Lamech took two wives. The name of the one was Adah, and the name of the other Zillah. <sup>20</sup> Adah bore Jabal; he was the father of those who dwell in tents and have livestock. <sup>21</sup> His brother's name was Jubal; he was the father of all those who play the lyre and pipe. <sup>22</sup> Zillah also bore Tubal-cain; he was the forger of all instruments of bronze and iron. The sister of Tubal-cain was Naamah.

<sup>23</sup> Lamech said to his wives:

"Adah and Zillah, hear my voice;

you wives of Lamech, listen to what I say:

I have killed a man for wounding me,

a young man for striking me.

<sup>24</sup> If Cain's revenge is sevenfold,

then Lamech's is seventy-sevenfold."

<sup>25</sup> And Adam knew his wife again, and she bore a son and called his name Seth, for she said, "God has appointed for me another offspring instead of Abel, for Cain killed him." <sup>26</sup> To Seth also a son was born, and he called his name Enosh. At that time people began to call upon the name of the LORD.



# Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

# Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

*Prayer of Commitment.* Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name.


Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven.


### GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

### Prayer Focus—Crossroads Prison Ministries

Crossroads Prison Ministries (CPM), formerly Crossroad Bible Institute, was founded thirty years ago as a way to disciple prisoners who had made a decision to follow Christ. The ministry's foundation is to form mentoring relationships between people in prison and volunteers from churches throughout the world. These relationships are formed through the use of Bible studies that are completed by the prisoner and mailed to the mentor, who reviews the lessons and responds back to the prisoner through encouraging letters. Currently CPM operates in 19 different countries and reaches 30,000 prisoners each year with a library of twelve Bible study courses. Eight Cornerstone members are involved in CPM.

- Pray for more mentors from Cornerstone.
- Pray for acceptance by local churches of CPM students once they are released from prison.
- Pray for resources for CPM to assist students in locating a loving and caring local church.

Today's message, "East of Eden" is taken from Genesis 4:I-26. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group.

- Last week we learned from Genesis 3:15 that redemptive history unfolds through the clash of two spiritual seeds ("offspring")—the seed of the woman and the seed of the serpent. How is this point illustrated in Genesis 4?
- Why did God have regard for Abel's offering but not Cain's? What does this teach us about the nature of true salvation?
- God says to Cain, "...sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must rule over it" (v.7). How is God calling you to rule over the sin that is crouching at the door of your life?
- On the surface, justice and grace seem opposed to one another, yet Cain experienced both from God. How does that work? What role has the justice and grace of God played in your life?
- Compare and contrast Lamech's song in Genesis 4:23-24 and Jesus words in Matthew 18:21-35. Do you find Jesus words comforting or concerning? Is there ever a time when we shouldn't forgive? Is there anyone in your life that you're struggling to forgive?
- How does the blood of Jesus speak a better word than Abel's blood (see Hebrews 12:22-24)?
