
This is the pattern of his love in redeeming and saving his people.

# New Testament Reading—Ephesians 4:17-24

Put on the new self, created after the likeness of God

<sup>17</sup>Now this I say and testify in the Lord, that you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds. <sup>18</sup>They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart. <sup>19</sup>They have become callous and have given themselves up to sensuality, greedy to practice every kind of impurity. <sup>20</sup>But that is not the way you learned Christ!— <sup>21</sup> assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, <sup>22</sup> to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, <sup>23</sup> and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, <sup>24</sup> and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.



# Corporate Confession of Sin—based on James 1:12-15

Pastor: Lord, we come to You confessing. You call the person blessed who remains steadfast under trial, for when they have stood the test, they will receive the crown of life.

All: You have promised life to those who love You and who stand firm.

Pastor: In our weakness and in our desire to avoid responsibility, we want to say that we are being tempted by You.

All: We know You cannot be tempted with evil and that You tempt no one, but we want to shift blame.

Pastor: In fact, it is our own desires that entice and lure us when we are tempted.

All: We place our desires as the affection of our hearts instead of desiring You.

Pastor: Our sinful desires when they have conceived give birth to sin.

All: And sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.



People: And also with you.


Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

# Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

# Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

*Prayer of Commitment.* Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.



**Prayer Focus**— Dave and Robin Dillard serve as the Executive Director and Office Administrator for Servant Group International (SGI), a non-profit ministry focused on sharing the hope and love of Christ in Muslim communities. SGI was established in 1992 in response to the large number of Iraqi Kurdish refugees relocating to Nashville following the first Gulf War. Since that time, SGI has expanded to include outreach projects in Iraq, Turkey and Greece. In Nashville, SGI manages a network of staff, volunteers and programs designed to help Nashville-area Christians meet and build Christ-centered friendships with their Muslim neighbors. In Iraq, SGI helps staff and resource a network of Christian schools enrolling thousands of Muslim students, and supports a number of projects designed to help refugee families return to their homes and rebuild their lives after ISIS. SGI also organizes short-term teams and projects to help serve among the large number of Syrian, Afghan and Iraqi refugees now in Greece.

- Pray for more volunteers to help with our summer reading and feeding programs for refugee kids in Nashville.
- Pray for our newest team members heading to Iraq in August, and for their support-raising this summer.
- Pray for our ability to encourage and shepherd a growing community of volunteers.
- Pray for the young Kurdish church in Nashville, that it will persevere and grow.

Today's message, "A Discerning Love," is taken from Philippians I:9-II. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family friend or Home Fellowship Group.

- I. Read Philippians I:I-II. How do you fit together the principle of I:6 and the prayer of I:9-II? Do you see tension or conflict between the two? How does Philippians 2:12-I3 contribute to your understanding?
- 2. Why do you think Paul insists that love needs to increase? that love needs to be discerning or informed? What is "wise love?"
- 3. "The whole art of life, I sometimes think, is the art of knowing what to leave out, what to ignore, what to put to one side." (Martyn Lloyd-Jones). Do you agree? If so, what areas do you find difficult to distinguish between? How do you go about making distinctions and deciding what to omit? What have you found helpful in that practice? Is there anything you need to ignore or put aside?
- 4. Read Psalm I:3 and Jeremiah 17:7-8 as background to verse II. How does the gospel "energize" love and fruitfulness?
- 5. If the Father (verse 6) is ceaselessly at work for the glory of the Son, and the Son (verse 11) is ceaselessly at work for the glory of the Father, how does that encourage you to be ceaselessly at work in your own spiritual growth? What are your plans to grow toward maturity? What can you do this summer?
