# Worship Notes

The sermon series on the Luke II and the Lord's Prayer continues with "Lead Us Not Into Temptation" and so we will focus on temptation and our great High Priest who was tempted even as we are. The Call to Worship from Psalm 3I refers to the Lo9rd as our refuge and fortress who leads, preserves, and recues His people. He continue by singing Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah and Psalm 27: God is My Strong Salvation—"In darkness and temptation, my Light, my Help is near."

The New Testament Reading from Hebrews 2 reminds us that Christ suffered when tempted and is able to help us as we are tempted. The Prayer of Confession from James I focuses on standing firm under trial, not submitting to temptation knowing that our sinful desires give birth to sin which brings forth death. Isaiah 43 reminds us that the Lord, our God, leads us through the trials of life.

For Communion we will sing Holy Father and At the Name of Jesus—a wonderful hymn on the person of Christ who is our "Captain in temptation's hour." We conclude with Jesus, What a Friend for Sinners—"tempted, tried, and sometimes failing, He, my strength, my victory wins!"


#### GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

Christ was made like his brothers

14 Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he [Jesus] himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, 15 and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery. 16 For surely it is not angels that he helps, but he helps the offspring of Abraham. 17 Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. 18 For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

### Corporate Confession of Sin-based on James 1:12-15

Pastor: Lord, we come to You confessing. You call the person blessed who remains steadfast under trial, for when they have stood the test, they will receive the crown of life.

All: You have promised life to those who love You and who stand firm.

Pastor: In our weakness and in our desire to avoid responsibility, we want to say that we are being tempted by You.

All: We know You cannot be tempted with evil and that You tempt no one, but we want to shift blame.

Pastor: In fact, it is our own desires that entice and lure us when we are tempted.

All: We place our desires as the affection of our hearts instead of desiring You.

Pastor: Our sinful desires when they have conceived give birth to sin.

All: And sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.

let us hold fast our confession.


For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses,


#### THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER


