



I The Spirit of the LORD God is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor;

he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;

4 They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.





# Corporate Confession of Sin—based on 2 Timothy 3:14-4:4

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. You charge us in Your Word to preach the Word and to be ready to do so at all times and to be complete and equipped for every good work through Your Scriptures.

All: But we do not continue in what we have learned and in what we firmly believed.

Pastor: You call us to reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching.

All: May we firmly believe what we have been taught from Your sacred Word.


## Silent Prayers of Confession

## The Reading of the Word—Psalm 78:I-8

Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! <sup>2</sup>I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, <sup>3</sup> things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us. <sup>4</sup> We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done. <sup>5</sup>He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children, <sup>6</sup> that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments; <sup>8</sup> and that they should not be like their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation whose heart was not steadfast, whose spirit was not faithful to God.

## Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

*Prayer of Commitment.* Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.


## GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

Today is the second message in our sermon series, "From Generation to Generation." The title for today's message is, "Our Call: Tell the Coming Generation" from Psalm 78:I-8. Please take time this week to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group.

- Why is story telling so important in Scripture?
- How is teaching true beliefs and right behaviors within or through the redemptive story different from teaching them apart from the redemptive story (see Deut. 6:20-25)? If you can, share a personal example to illustrate this.
- The Scripture regularly links salvation—true wisdom—with a willingness to see. In Psalm 78, this is pictured as listening in faith. What's the relationship between listening and salvation?
- Psalm 78 calls the story of redemption a "parable" and a "dark saying" (v.2). How should these terms shape our understanding of the story of redemption and how to tell it? How do these terms shape the hearer's expectation of the story of redemption?
- What help do you need in learning how to tell the story of redemption? Who in your sphere of influence needs to hear the story of redemption? Take time to personally share your answers. Solicit those around you for help and prayer.
