Pastor: Feed us with the finest wheat and satisfy us with honey from the rock.


Silent Prayers of Confession

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.



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Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

Today is the third and final message in our series "From Generation to Generation." The title of today's message is "Our Hope: The Covenant Keeping God" from Deuteronomy 7:6-II. Please take some time to look over the questions below, answering and discussing them with your family or Home Fellowship Group.

- I. Read I Peter 2:9-12. How do you feel about God's demand that your life is to be distinctive from the "nations" or people around you? Why do you feel like that?
- 2. We could summarize the starting point of our passage as: "Surrendering our privileged position with compromise is unthinkable." What are some areas of life where you are prone to compromise with the standards of the world? In what ways you are inclined to fit in or blend in with the world around you?
- 3. What would be some wrong reasons to "stand out" from the crowd? What is it about standing out that is difficult? Has your distinctive lifestyle ever cost you something? Ever led to a conversation with others about what you believe? Explain.
- 4. Read Deut. 7:6. What "treasured possession" do you own? How do you treat it differently? Read Zephaniah 3:17. When do you experience the Father's delight in you? What hinders that experience?
- 5. Read Deut. 7:7-8. How do you respond to the truth that God sought you out—not for anything in you or about you?
- 6. Why do you think our passage includes a declaration about God's faithfulness? What difference would it make if that were removed? What is missing from the gospel you believe if you forget or downplay that truth?
- 7. Meditate on what God has done in the gospel to "redeem" and "set you apart" as his own treasured possession. How does this move you to praise him and love him?
