
All: In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also.

We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.



Today's message, "Scripture Alone" was taken from 2 Timothy 3:14-16. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group.

- Why is it important that the Scripture is "breathed out" by God and not just "breathed into" by God (v.16)?
- Paul says Scripture is profitable "...for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (v.16). Based on the message, take a few minutes to define each of these terms, considering their spiritual importance for the maturing of the Christian.
- Based on the list of profits from the Word of God (v.17), why is it important that we're committed to read *all* Scripture and not just the parts we like? Do you need to make any changes in your Bible reading patterns to ensure that you're getting a steady diet of the whole counsel of God? Share ideas for Bible reading and study.
- Take time now to give testimony for how God's Word has taught, reproved, corrected, and trained you over the years. After each testimony, pause briefly together in prayer and give thanks for the Word.
