

Rejoice and sing forevermore; Alleluia.


Announcements & Preparation

- ⁶ Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel."





suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.


He descended into hell. On the third day He rose again from the dead.


He ascended into Heaven and now sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty,


from whence He shall come to judge the living and the dead.





Words of Institution and the Lord's Table

Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. Take the bread at the first table & then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession

The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name.

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, As we forgive our debtors.


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

Prayer Focus—Harvest Prison Ministry (HPM) was founded in 2002 as an outreach of Hickory Grove Presbyterian Church, Mt. Juliet, TN for the sole purpose of preaching and teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the men behind the walls, and for "the equipping of the saints to do the work of the ministry." Its vision is to see more men reconciled to God and their families, and to aide them both prayerfully and financially to re-enter society enabled by the grace of God to live godly and productive lives. Rick Allen and Richard Jennings, from the Nashville Presbytery, currently minister at both Riverbend Maximum Security Institution (RMSI) and Lois M. DeBerry Special Needs Facility (DSNF) six days a week. HPM is the only reformed ministry at those facilities. Please pray for:

- Ray Tullos—he will be released this Saturday. He is a believer and is ready to be a productive citizen.
- Jimmy Kertzman—he has been out for a few years and is having some real struggles.
- Eddie—he is serving 7 years and God is using him to live out his faith each and every day.
- Frank—has 3 more years. He is an older man and really loves the Lord and helps us with the Bible studies.
- Greg—has been out for 4 months and is doing great. He just moved into his own apartment and is working in the Gulch. Please pray God will use him and guard his heart from temptation.
- Rick Allen's son, Chris, who is prodigal.
- DSNF is in need of a chaplain. Please pray God will provide a man who loves God and will love the men!

Today's message, "Give Thanks: Remember God's Faithfulness in the Past" is taken from Philippians I:3-6. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group (HFG).

- In Paul's prayer, he thanks God for the "partnership (fellowship) of the gospel" he shares with the Christians in Philippi. Take a moment to think about the members of the church. What thanksgiving can you offer to God for the partnership or fellowship you share with them?
- Paul prays his thanksgiving to the Lord, but he also *tells* the Christians in Philippi his prayers of thanksgiving for them. Who can you encourage today by sharing why you're thankful to God for them?
- Discuss the relationship between prayerful remembrance of God's blessings and a heart of thanksgiving.
- Think back over God's faithfulness to you. Ponder the many blessings you've received and let gratefulness
 fill your heart. Share with your HFG or those around you if time permits. Close this reflection in prayer,
 offering thanksgiving to God.
