Pastor: He provides food for those who fear him; he remembers his covenant forever.


All: The works of his hands are faithful and just; all his precepts are trustworthy;

Pastor: they are established forever and ever, to be performed with faithfulness and uprightness.


All: He sent redemption to his people; he has commanded his covenant forever.

GOD TEACHES US THROUGH HIS WORD

The Reading of the Word—Philemon I:8-16

⁸ Accordingly, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do what is required, ⁹ yet for love's sake I prefer to appeal to you—I, Paul, an old man and now a prisoner also for Christ Jesus— ¹⁰ I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus whose father I became in my imprisonment. ¹¹ (Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.) ¹² I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. ¹³ I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, ¹⁴ but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own accord. ¹⁵ For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶ no longer as a bondservant but more than a bondservant, as a beloved brother—especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

Today's message, "A Loving Appeal" is taken from Philemon I:8-I6. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group.

- What's the wisdom behind Paul's choice to "appeal" to Philemon instead of "command" him (see v. 8-9, I4)?
- How does Paul's interpretive suggestion of Onesimus departing (v. 15-16) provide Philemon a new way of looking at the situation?
- R.C. Lucas writes, "To live in this evil world Christians cannot avoid living within social structures that are unjust and unequal, though their presence within it as salt and light should help to change structures. Yet, whether one is born an 'Onesimus' or a 'Philemon,' one can find in Christ the secret of spiritual freedom." What point(s) is Lucas making? How can we apply this principle to our own time?
- How is this letter a model of Christian discipleship and peacemaking? What specific ways has God been speaking to you through the study of this letter?
