

All: We are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.


Pastor: Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise!


All: Give thanks to him; bless his name!

- 43 Whoever is wise, let him attend to these things; let them consider the steadfast love of the LORD.



All: Let these melodies fill us with thankfulness in our hearts to You.


Silent Prayers of Confession



He ascended into Heaven and now sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty,


from whence He shall come to judge the living and the dead.





Words of Institution and the Lord's Table

Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.


At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. Take the bread at the first table & then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession




GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

After calling His people into His presence, forgiving their sins, instructing them in His Word, and providing a foretaste of the marriage supper of the Lamb, God sends His people into the world to show His light in the darkness.

Prayer Focus—Crossroads Prison Ministries (CPM), formerly Crossroad Bible Institute, was founded thirty years ago as a way to disciple prisoners who had made a decision to follow Christ. The ministry's foundation is to form mentoring relationships between people in prison and volunteers from churches throughout the world. These relationships are formed through the use of Bible studies that are completed by the prisoner and mailed to the mentor, who reviews the lessons and responds back to the prisoner through encouraging letters. Currently CPM operates in 19 different countries and reaches 30,000 prisoners each year with a library of twelve Bible study courses. Eight Cornerstone members are involved in CPM.

- Pray for more mentors from Cornerstone.
- Pray for acceptance by local churches of CPM students once they are released from prison.
- Pray for resources for CPM to assist students in locating a loving and caring local church.

Today's message, "Give Thanks: Hoping in God's Promises for the Future" is taken from Philippians 1:3-6. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends, or Home Fellowship Group (HFG).

- In Paul's prayer for the church at Philippi, he gives thanks for their "partnership in the gospel" (v.5). The word for partnership is the Greek word *koinonia*, which is often translated fellowship. How is the word fellowship used in the Bible differently from the way we use it today?
- According to the message, what were the four aspects of the partnership in the gospel that Paul shared with the church at Philippi? What do these teach us about the nature of Christian fellowship and ministry?
- Paul moves from remembrances and thanksgivings to hope for the future in v. 6. How does God's past faithfulness and the present evidences of grace in our lives lay foundations for future hope? Share a story of God's faithfulness in your past that continues to give you hope for his future faithfulness to you.
- James Montgomery Boice once wrote, "God never starts anything he doesn't finish." In what way do you need to hear and believe that truth personally? Take a moment now to pray to that end.
