

New Testament Reading—Romans 5:I-II

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ² Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹ Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. ¹⁰ For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. ¹¹ More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE & RECONCILIATION

The People of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Corporate Prayer of Confession—based on I John 4:7-21 & 3:17

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. Love comes from You, and we know we are to love one another.

All: Sometimes our lack of love brings into question whether we truly know You for You are love.

Pastor: Because of Your love for us, we also ought to love one another for You abide in us and Your love is perfected in us.

All: If we confess that Jesus is the Son of God, You abide in us and we abide in You.

Pastor: You are love and Your love is perfected in us so that we might have confidence on the day of judgment. There is no fear in love; give us a perfect love that casts out fear.

All: Because You first loved us, we should love one another. Too often we say we love You, but act in ways that express hatred towards our brothers and sisters.

Pastor: But You command us to love our brothers and sisters even as we love You.

But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need,
yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?

All: Give us the grace to truly love our neighbors—wholeheartedly, sacrificially, and without fear.

In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

¹⁷ So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me. ¹⁸ If he has wronged you at all, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. ¹⁹ I, Paul, write this with my own hand: I will repay it—to say nothing of your owing me even your own self. ²⁰ Yes, brother, I want some benefit from you in the Lord. Refresh my heart in Christ.

²¹ Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say. ²² At the same time, prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping that through your prayers I will be graciously given to you.

²³ Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus, sends greetings to you, ²⁴ and so do Mark,

Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke, my fellow workers.

Guidelines for the Lord's Supper


The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.

At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.



Today's message, "The Great Exchange" is taken from Philemon I:17-25. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family friend or Home Fellowship Group.

- I. Read 2 Cor. 5:21. How does Paul's offer to pay any debt of Onesimus (verse 18) remove the barrier for true reconciliation between Philemon and Onesimus? How does Paul grant *his* status to Onesimus? HINT: verse 17. How does that give you a window into the gospel?
- 2. Paul anticipates Philemon's "obedience" in verse 21. Read Romans 1:5 and 16:26 where Paul uses the phrase, "the obedience of faith." How do "gospel" and "imperative" fit together into what we might call "the gospel imperative?"
- 3. Paul wants this house church in Colassae to be a light on a hill, a community "in the Lord' where new kingdom realities are breaking into the present world." What are some of those realities? Do you see that happening in our midst? What needs to occur for more of that to occur?
- 4. Paul describes his relationship with Philemon as "partner." More than mere friendship or similarity of outlook, for Paul this is a spiritual alliance built around common activities born of common loyalty to Christ. Do you have that sort of "partner" in your life? How does that relationship work in your case? If not, who might be that person?
- 5. What specific ways has God been speaking to you through the study of this letter?
