



All: For a thousand years in your sight are but as yesterday when it is past, or as a watch in the night.


Pastor: So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.


All: Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.


Old Testament Reading—Psalm I


- I Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;
- 2 but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.
- 3 He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.
- 4 The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away.
- 5 Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous;
- 6 for the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE & RECONCILIATION

The People of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.





Corporate Confession of Sin-based on Romans 6:10-23 & 7:4-6

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. When we were slaves to sin, we were free to ignore righteousness.

All: But the fruit we were producing at that time was from things of which we now are ashamed.

Pastor: The end of those things is death. But now we have been set free from sin and have become Your slaves.

All: And the fruit we produce leads to sanctification and eternal life.

Pastor: For the wages of sin is death, but You give us the free gift of eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

All: We have died to the law through the body of Christ.

Pastor: We have died to the law and are free to belong to one another and to Christ who has been raised from the dead—

All: In order that we may bear fruit for You.

Pastor: For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our bodies to bear fruit for death.

All: But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive so that we may serve in the new way of Your Spirit.

The Reading of the Word—Luke 2:22-32

²² And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons." ²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶ And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷ And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸ he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

²⁹ "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word;

³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation

31 that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel."



Guidelines for the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is the family meal for Christians. We invite all baptized Christians who are members of a congregation that proclaims the gospel, and who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ to join us.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. You can find some sample prayers on the next page. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with His people, the church.


At Cornerstone, we come forward to receive communion. You may take the bread at the first table and then proceed to either side for the wine/grape juice.

Prayers for Those Not Taking the Lord's Supper

If you are not able to partake in the Lord's Supper today, please use this time to meditate on one of the following prayers.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth. Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open me to the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life you promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief. Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment. Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship through membership in your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Intercession

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name.



GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT TO BE LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

After calling His people into His presence, forgiving their sins, instructing them in His Word, and providing a foretaste of the marriage supper of the Lamb, God sends His people into the world to show His light in the darkness.

Benediction—from Luke 1:76-79

Go before the Lord to prepare His ways. Give knowledge of salvation to His people in the forgiveness of their sins, because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high—to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace. *Amen*.



Prayer Focus—Ross Lockwood is the Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) campus minister at Western Kentucky University (WKU) in Bowling Green, Kentucky. RUF is the college ministry agency of the Presbyterian Church in America, and the mission of RUF is to reach students for Christ and equip them to serve for a lifetime of ministry in and through the local church. RUF "reaches and equips" through weekly worship nights on campus, various small groups on and off campus, one-on-one pastoral and counseling ministry and hosting on campus outreach and fellowship events. RUF at WKU is in it's 10th year on campus, and Ross is in his 4th year as the campus minister. Ross is married to Anne Todd, and has two boys Bo (4 yrs.) and Ira (16 mos.). Please pray for RUF at WKU in the following ways:

- Pray for interns Matt Horne and Cathy Clark as they raise financial support over winter break. Also pray for Ross' financial support raising efforts during the month of December.

Today's message, "Singing with Simeon: The Nunc Dimmitis" is taken from Luke 2:22-32. Please take time to discuss the questions below with your family, friends or Home Fellowship Group.

- I. What has prepared Simeon for what (who) he encounters in the temple court?
- 2. Before Simeon, faith meant waiting. After him, faith will mean following. How does doxology (praise) turn to obedience (following) in your life? What does following Christ require? Cost?
- 3. These references to the Holy Spirit and the "consolation of Israel" (Luke 2:25) point forward to Luke 4:18-19 where Jesus quotes Isaiah 61:1-2. In what ways is Jesus your consolation or comfort? Where do you need His consolation or comfort today? Take some time to ask Him for that now.
- 4. Simeon seems to have a cheerful readiness to die ("depart"). What would need to happen in your life for you to be ready to depart in peace? Read Romans 5:I-2. To depart in peace is to die with this sure hope.
- 5. Can you turn these words into a prayer? "As we learn to love and trust the Lord "we believe the promises he has given in his word. They have become the spectacle lens through which we see everything and that is what injects the melody of hope into our lives." (Sinclair Ferguson)
